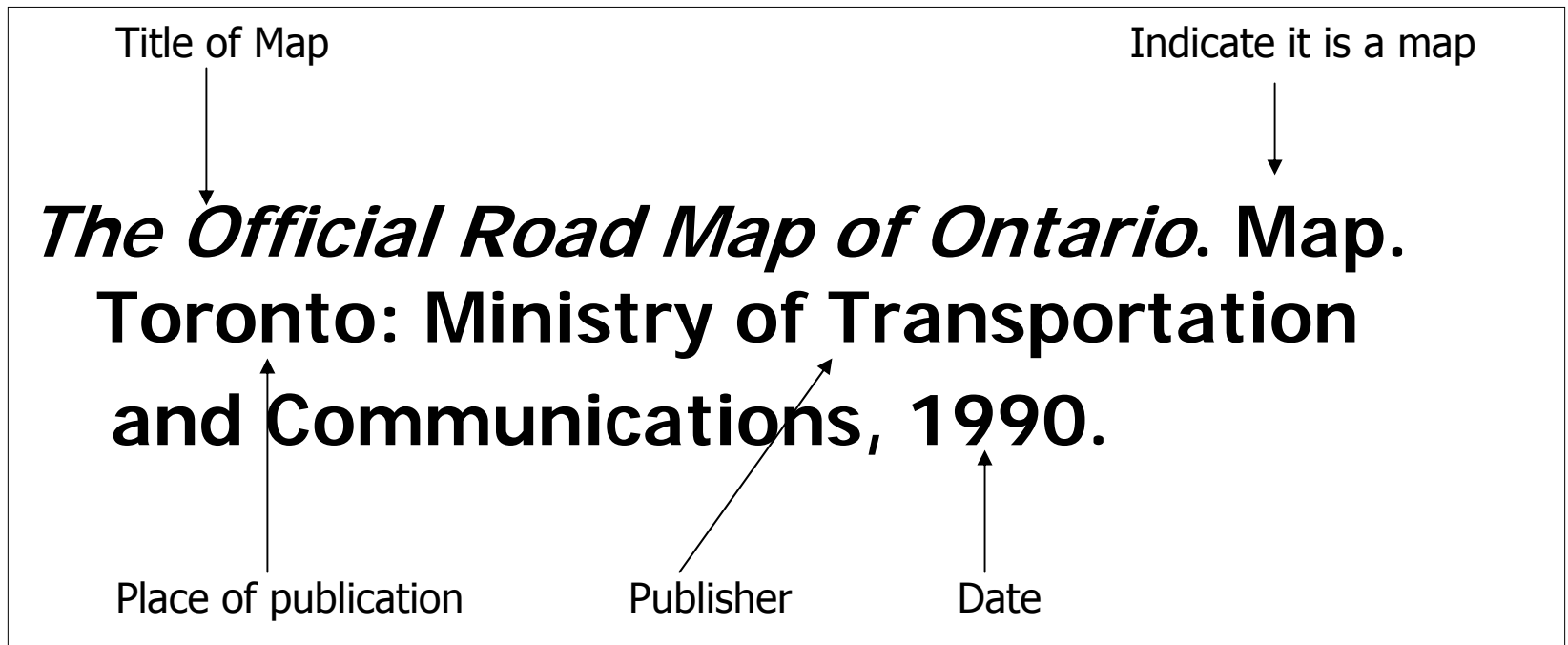
Newspaper Article
